

BOARD OF REGENTS POLICY:
***Private Professional Practice – University of Minnesota Medical School
Duluth***

SECTION I. SCOPE.

Subd. 3. Use of Assets.

Where University assets are used in connection with the private professional practice, such assets shall be used in support of the mission of the Medical School Duluth and pursuant to appropriate rules and controls established by the president or delegate.

Subd. 4. Faculty Compensation.

Faculty compensation shall reflect relative contributions to all the Medical School Duluth functions of teaching, research, administration, and clinical care. Compensation limitations shall take into account generally recognized standards for academic medical centers, local market conditions, the value of University faculty appointments and their benefits, and other relevant factors.

Subd. 5. Compliance with Law and Policy.

Medical School Duluth faculty members must comply with applicable law; University, AHC, and Medical School Duluth policies; and recognized professional practices.

SECTION IV. ADMINISTRATION.

Subd. 1. Responsibility.

The president or delegate shall be responsible for assuring, consistent with contractual obligations and limitations, compliance with this policy.

Subd. 2. Governance of Academic Issues.

The University shall continue to govern academic issues.

Subd. 3. Board of Regents Policies.

Medical School Duluth faculty members remain subject to current and future Board of Regents policies.

SECTION V. IMPLEMENTATION.

Subd. 1. Operating Procedures.

The president or delegate shall establish operating procedures for the implementation of this policy and for assuring that appropriate controls, including audits, are in place.

Subd. 2. Consistency with Policy.

All contracts, agreements, and operating procedures of the Medical School Duluth relating to the private professional practice shall be consistent with this policy and shall be subject to review by the president or delegate for compliance.
